Three sessions of the International Talk were held in December and February, cosponsored by SAISUA and the Office for Strategy of International Programs (OSIP) of the Center for Globalization.

In the December session, Japanese students who had studied abroad told about their experiences, and international students introduced their own culture. At the tea party following their presentations, the participants enjoyed sharing their experiences related to international exchange.

For the sessions of the International Talk in February, Mr. Takao Aoyama, the director of Aizu Wakamatsu International Association was

invited to provide a lecture on "Aizu gaku (Aizu-logy)". Japanese as well as international students deepened their knowledge of "Aizu," where the UoA is located. After the lecture, international students gained firsthand experience of calligraphy with Japanese students giving them advice.

The International Talk has become an important opportunity for UoA students to deepen not only their international understanding but also their knowledge of Aizu and Japan.

SAISUA also supported various other international exchange activities organized by the OSIP, international students' visit to local elementary schools, for example.
